The 20th edition of CROSSING EUROPE Film Festival Linz takes place from 26 April to 1 May. In today's press release, we are announcing the four **opening films**. In addition, to mark the festival anniversary, we will also present two highlights from the early years of CROSSING EUROPE on the big screen again as **Anniversary Pic[k]s**. One of them as a **free-entry** festival kick-off during an **open-air screening** at **Lentos Kunstmuseum** on the Donaulände on **April 20**.

Also, **CROSSING EUROPE @HOME** once again provides the opportunity to experience a piece of the festival at home or on the go with **VOD offers** on **KINO VOD CLUB**, **filmfriend**, **Flimmit** and on the **ÖBB Railnet**. We are also releasing new info on the YAAAS! Youth Program, with details on the **YAAAS! Close-Up**, **Workshop Rally**, and the **Youth Jury**. The nightly party atmosphere during the festival is provided by live acts and DJs at the **Nightline** on the OK Deck, whose line-up you can find in this release.

Aside from that, we would like to point out the following dates: Our **program press conference** takes place on Tuesday, **13 April**, at the Moviemento Linz and will also be available as a stream on the festival website, the complete **festival program** will be available online from **14 April**, and **ticket sales** start on **17 April**.

### Opening Films on 26 April 2023

CROSSING EUROPE 2023 will once again open with four films that are a representative cross-section of this year's festival program and, with their thematic and artistic diversity, stand for the richness of European cinema. Moreover, films from almost all program sections can be seen on opening day already from 4 p.m.

With her Berlinale competition entry 20.000 ESPECIES DE ABEJAS | 20,000 SPECIES OF BEES, Estibaliz Urresola Solaguren delivers an impressive feature film debut, for which the only eight-year-old Sofía Otero was awarded the Silver Bear for Best Leading Performance. The highly topical and evocative documentary SHIDNIY FRONT | EASTERN FRONT by Vitaly Mansky and Yevhen Titarenko shows the brutality of the war in Ukraine in gloomy footage directly from the front. Tribute guest Angeliki Papoulia shines with her impressive performance in Syllas Tzoumerkas's drama A BLAST, which drastically reflects the effects of the Greek financial crisis of the 2010s on the population. The *Night Sight* program section kicks off with SVĚTLONOC | NIGHTSIREN, where director Tereza Nvotová breaks down the classical witch narrative in the context of patriarchal structures and misogyny.

After the opening films, our audience is warmly invited to wind down the evening at the **Nightline** on the **OK Deck** with live act **Euroteuro**.

An eight-year-old is suffering because people keep addressing the child in ways that cause discomfort. They insist on calling the child by the birth name Aitor. And the nickname, Cocó, even if less obviously wrong, does not feel right either. During a summer in the Basque country, the child confides these worries to relatives and friends. But how can a mother handle her child's quest for identity when she is herself still dealing with her own ambivalent parental legacy? Basque director Estibaliz Urresola Solaguren's debut feature is a sunny drama. By adopting more than one point of view, Urresola is respecting the incredible complexity that is gender identity, and touching on one perhaps less obvious aspect of transitioning: your mentality. #### SHIDNIY FRONT | EASTERN FRONT

Kyiv, August 24, 2022, Ukraine's Independence Day. A burnt-out tank on a deserted street. Half a year has passed since the whole world became aware of Russia's attack. It actually began in 2014, but many did not perceive it as such at the time. This is also explained by the voice in the commentary that belongs to Vitaly Mansky. The other director, Yevhen Titarenko, captures an insider's images which reveal precisely what (this) war means. He has been with the "Hospitallers" volunteer medical battalion since 2014 and is now on full duty. At times disturbingly raw and direct, yet always enlightening, this film shows in close-up how a nation is fighting for its survival. (Berlinale)

Maria is on the run. Behind her, fire and a briefcase full of money. In front of her, the hopeless vastness of the motorway. Only a day before, she was a caring mother, a loving wife, a responsible daughter. Today, she has gone rogue. Set in the fervent years of the collapse of the Greek economy, A BLAST tells the story of a generation's disillusionment and radicalization. Maria starts her adult life with the best of intentions. Ten years after, no matter where she looks, her world is cracking up. Unwilling to reconcile with a life of unreciprocated care, lost dignity, and broken-down desire to live, Maria attacks. All the typical trappings of witchcraft – the naked moonlit rituals, the familiar relationship with wolves and snakes, the sexual abandon, the knowledge and use of herbs, the concealed baldness, the mutated or murdered livestock, the dancing around bonfires, the missing children – are present and correct in NIGHTSIREN, but are mostly rationalised and all reconfigured as something harmless. For this is a film less about female malefactors than about the villagers' patriarchal structures and deep-seated misogynies (some internalised by the local women themselves) which suppress difference and readily blame innocent women. ### Anniversary Pic[k]s: Open Air on 20 April & European Panorama Specials

To mark the festival anniversary, two **highlights from the early years** that reflect the spirit of CROSSING EUROPE will be shown again on the big screen: The very first opening film, the 2004 documentary **ÜBER EINE STRASSE** | ABOUT A STREET by **Edith Stauber** and **Michaela Mair**, is a long-term observation of urban life in Linz. The film will not only be shown in the *European Panorama Special* section, but also as a kick-off prior to the start of the festival, a CROSSING EUROPE **open-air film event** (free entry) at Lentos Kunstmuseum on **20 April, 8 p.m**. The jointly developed omnibus movie **LOST AND FOUND** (CE05) gathers six directors who back then were considered "new voices" of European cinema, some of whom rank among the award-winning big names of the European film industry today: **Stefan Arsenijević, Nadejda Koseva, Mait Laas, Kornél Mundruczó, Cristian Mungiu**, and **Jasmila Žbanić**. The film will also be presented in the *European Panorama Special* section.

YAAAS! Close-Up: YOUKI Goes YAAAS! is an event organized within the YAAAS! Youth Program at CROSSING EUROPE, presented in co-operation with <u>YOUKI International Youth Media Festival</u>. The event invites young filmmakers to offer the audience a glimpse into their work in the film sector during an open discussion format. This year's guests are **Brigitta Kanyaro** (\* 1991, director, actor) and **Michael Schindegger** (\* 1981, cinematographer, director). YAAAS! Close-Up takes place on **30 April 2023**, **4 p.m.**, on the **OK Deck**, and the event is also available for viewing via **livestream** on **crossingeurope.at**.

Another component of the Youth Program is the **YAAAS! Workshop Rally**. On **27 April 2023**, the choice is between **four workshops with a practical orientation** that present topics like flip-book transitions, coding, or movie trick basics. Workshop Rally is supported by OeAD (Agency for Education and Internationalisation) and the <u>Federal</u> <u>Ministry of Education</u>, <u>Science and Research</u>.
