FESTIVAL AWARDS 2023

The Awards Ceremony of the 20th edition of the CROSSING EUROPE Film Festival Linz took place today in the Ursulinensaal of the OK Linz, the atmospheric evening was hosted by Miriam Hie.

"The jury has come to a conclusion to grant the main prize of the documentary competition to two films out of 11. For an optimism (of a better future) manifested through the protagonists of these two creative documentary films, one that shows the war and daily reality from the perspective of the people whose lives have been halted and fallen into a routine where nothing happens and not much can be done, while the other one reflects the expression of tenderness and constant proving of unconditional love.

If the rest of the world was full of love and free, alike the protagonists of these both films, we would not have had this ongoing war in Ukraine."

"It has been a challenging task to select one winning film from among the great entries in the YAAAS! Competition. This film is about very young mothers who are cared for together in a house. This serious topic has been depicted in a very realistic way. Everyday life has many facets, there is room for all kinds of emotions. It is an important film for young people – not just young women. This film cracks open to some extent the taboo of talking about sex. Our final decision was to award the prize to PETITES | LITTLE ONES by Julie Lerat-Gersant."

CLOUDY MEMORIES

Isabella Friedl, IT 2022, 50 min

The JURY COMPETITION – Local Artist (Nicola von Leffern, Markus Reindl & Anna Spanlang) explained their decision with the words:

The private is political! In unadorned, intimate images the filmmaker tells a family story, which is the story of the women in her family. When grandma says: "Well, you have some guts / Na du traust' da" she puts quite a few things in a nutshell, because: We are not used to a historiography from a female perspective.

"How was it back then, with an unwanted pregnancy, to get an abortion? What kind of mother was grandmother to you? Who takes care of grandma at home, when she is suffering from dementia – she of course already took care of her own mother back in the time – and: who will, in case it is necessary, be responsible for taking care of my mother? Why are my memories so different, from yours, the filmmaker asks."

In a very touching way, the film successfully shapes tabooed stories of women from different generations into a sensitive narrative, without causing them embarrassment. We see and hear the voice of a directress, who, with great kindness and her open heart is breaking the familiar silence. With this film, she is encouraging us, the audience, to finally negotiate these highly emotional questions within our own families. 101-year-old Betty Rid Soskin says: "The questions are important, the answers are only temporary.

DE FACTO

Selma Doborac, AT/DE 2023, 130 min

"Layer upon layer of abstraction is cast over the research, yet the film is stripped down to its core. Carefully orchestrated details in image and sound contrast the brute force of the spoken word. Performed in breathless rhythm, the film gets into the heads of perpetrators and war criminals, presenting an inside view - without judging and without dramatizing. The maelstrom that develops is painful and lingering. While scene after scene the light leaves the set in the forest, the cinema in our heads remains brightly lit. Those images bear witness to atrocities that are sadly all too present – even in this very moment. The director has succeeded in creating a masterpiece about the question of morality and the unleashing of violence."

"The music history of Linz since the 1990s and, furthermore, the history of music videos at Crossing Europe is inseparably linked to the hip-hop genre. If one of the O.G.s of Austrian hip-hop and an exceptional talent from the new generation team up for new approach to the theme, its video version will also have to tell new stories. That is why in the video, inner monologues entertainingly become dialogues and the conquest and appropriation of spaces becomes a principle. The pompous, stereotype-loaded room that holds hip-hop and pop culture hostage is not there to flex, but in a convincing one-take sequence, its opulent model is instead blown open with the help of one's own head and then torched."
