15 Years! Crossing Europe

"The historical occasion of the most recent round of expansions of the European Union and the bid by the city of Linz to be named Cultural Capital 2009 are a welcome symbolic start for the CROSSING EUROPE Film Festival Linz, but not its only starting point. CROSSING EUROPE is a pan-European festival that stands not only for geographical, but also and primarily for cinematographic diversity. At the same time, we consciously take no aesthetic or political boundaries into consideration...," is what it says in the preface of the first festival catalogue from 2004. The programmatic direction of CROSSING EUROPE was already clearly evident here, which is still distinguished up to the present by a firmly pro-European stance and a boundless pleasure in cinematic discoveries. Over the past 15 years CROSSING EUROPE has matured into a cinephile festival that unites filmmakers with a stance, who bring European life worlds to the screen using diverse means. Vibrant, open-minded, critical and diverse is the film culture that CROSSING EUROPE stands for.

Even though this year's catalogue preface is more pessimistic about the state of the peace project of Europe, the festival team around the festival director Christine Dollhofer takes the **15th edition of the festival** as an occasion to celebrate European auteur cinema in all its facets for six days. With 245,000 visitors, 1,500 film guests and 415 world premieres since 2004, CROSSING EUROPE presents itself as a cineaste showcase of Europe and relies on the appeal and diversity of European filmmaking.

For almost 15 years CROSSING EUROPE has been devoted to the idea of accessibly presenting sophisticated European filmmaking in Linz and offers an opportunity for a direct exchange with film guests present from all over Europe. For a week the city center of Linz, with the established festival district around the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter and the festival cinemas Moviemento and City-Kino, is transformed into the throbbing heart of the festival, drawing around 23,000 visitors in 2017. A year later, with the 15th edition, a further chapter of the festival's success story is to be written.

Across Europe in Six Days

This year the cinematic map ranges from Iceland to Calabria and from the Atlantic to the Urals. With 182 hand-picked feature films and documentaries from more than 40 countries, Europe is newly surveyed on the screen. The audience is invited to discover current socio-political but also artistic-eccentric works, as well as highlights from the past festival season and local filmmaking. For film discussions, talks and masterclasses, around 140 film guests from all over Europe are expected, including many past film guests contributing new films to the anniversary celebration. Crossover projects at the intersection of film/media art and the Nightline with exciting acts on six evenings round out the multifaceted line-up. And with six screenings of film highlights and prize-winning films on May 1st, the festival "bestows" itself with an extra day in honor of this small anniversary.

In addition to the three competition sections (Competition Fiction, Competition Documentary and Competition Local Artists), the program structure also includes the long-established sections Working Worlds (this year with the theme "Dreaming Under Capitalism" focusing on the dreams/nightmares of working people), European Panorama Fiction & Documentary (with selected highlights from the past festival season) and Night Sight (dedicated again to the "fantastic"). The series Architecture and Society deals this year with "Space.Power.Control", and Cinema Next Europe, presented for the fourth time, attests to the "Sense and Sensibility" of young talents in European cinema. Not to be forgotten – this year's Tribute, which is devoted to the Italian director Edoardo Winspeare, an important representative of Italian "Neo-Neorealism" due to decades of intense engagement with his home region of Apulia. With Spotlight a section is launched now for the second time, focusing on an exceptional talent in European filmmaking, the Romanian producer Ada Solomon. The program is rounded out with a newly designed educational program for school pupils and apprentices (key word SCHOOL @ CROSSING EUROPE) and, as always, by the extensive accompanying program with discussion events and masterclasses (for the second time including the format Trouble Features - A Conflict Program), the musical Nightline and a high-quality crossover program at the intersection of film, visual art and media art in the OK Offenes Kulturhaus and in the Ars Electronica Center (in DEEP SPACE 8K), so that also in this anniversary year CROSSING EUROPE promises again to be a fascinating journey through the (film) continent of Europe.

Facts & Figures

In the official program international festival guests and the local cinema audience can expect a total of 182 selected feature films, documentaries and short films from 48 different countries – including a total of 123 premieres (27 world premieres, 4 international premieres and 92 Austrian premieres). Of these – wholly in keeping with balanced gender equality programming – almost half (48%), specifically 86 works, were (co-) directed by women.

The festival year 2018, in other words the 15th edition of the festival, comprises a total of **182** film program positions and 21 accompanying programs.

In addition, the Video Library is available to professional guests with about 94 films from Austria (in cooperation with the Diagonale – Festival of Austrian Film) and 10 titles from the East Silver Caravan program.

Around **700** film, press and industry guests from Austria and abroad are expected at CROSSING EUROPE 2018, including numerous film students and around **140** film guests.

Financial Situation

Again in 2018 – for the 15th anniversary – Festival Director Christine Dollhofer and her team aim to meet the **expectations** of the professional audience and the local cinema audience, to offer six vibrant and inspiring festival days in the Upper Austrian capital. To achieve this goal, CROSSING EUROPE depends on the financial, organizational, and ideal support from its funders, sponsors and partners. The **financial situation of the festival is stable but always precarious**. Fortunately, and despite great uncertainty ahead of time, the commitment of our funders from Austria has remained the same in the end. A valorization of the funding is urgently necessary, because annually **rising costs in all organizational units** are taking effect, the sources of income are exhausted, and services in return are also becoming more and more complex.

In times of stagnating cultural budgets (because remaining the same automatically means less, since index adjustment is not taken into consideration) in the public and in the private sector, however, we can still speak of a relatively solid financial foundation. The lack of a bank sponsor in 2018 has fortunately been compensated by two mid-sized business due to enthusiasm for the festival, and also by a stronger engagement on the part of the Linz AG.

For the future, however, it is absolutely necessary to expand the framework conditions, in other words funding for Crossing Europe. From the experience of having to apply for funding every year (no multi-year funding contracts) and often very late confirmation, planning ahead is often linked with great risks for us.

Thanks to Our Partners

All in all, this year CROSSING EUROPE can rely on around 70 different funding and cooperation partners. The festival owes thanks to its **main funders** (City of Linz, Province of Upper Austria, Federal Ministry for EU, Art, Culture and Media in the Federal Chancellery Office, ÖFI – Austrian Film Institute and CREATIVE EUROPE).

A special contribution to the success of the festival from the beginning has been the spatial proximity of the festival venues to one another in the city center of Linz. Again in 2018 a major portion of festival events – film screenings, talks, Nightline, installations and exhibitions – will take place in the traditional festival district located in the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter: OK Offenes Kulturhaus, Moviemento, City-Kino, Kapu and Ursulinensaal will all be festival locations again. For this reason, very special thanks go to the two most important event partners and their teams: Wolfgang Steininger (manager of the program cinemas Moviemento & City-Kino) and Martin Sturm (artistic director of the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter). In addition, in 2018 we are happy to be able to keep DEEP SPACE 8K in the Ars Electronica Center Linz as a further venue, which enriches the festival with another 3D-capable screening location.

The **Upper Austrian Culture Quarter** – not only well established as festival center but also with the OK as an exhibition house – brings two new venues into the program this year. Projects will be shown that have been

especially developed for these locations, which go beyond the conventional crossover between film and visual art into the public space of a former filling station at the intersection to urban space, and at night in the club UNTEN another public will be reached. The video installation THE LEOPARD (WESTERN UNION: SMALL BOATS), 2007 by the renowned artist Isaac Julien, presented in the OK, is one of this year's highlights. (see p. 24)

In addition to the **media partners**, including Der Standard, Ö1 and OÖNachrichten, the festival also thanks its **long-term** sponsors, such as Trumer Privatbrauerei, the Linz AG, which makes the festival visible every year with the CROSSING EUROPE-tram and makes another contribution this year in the area of film eduction in conjunction with the project "Film Apprentices at CROSSING EUROPE (see p. 26), and the company Europack, our bag sponsor for many years, which also supports the *GOLDEN BAG Display Window Competition* now for the fifth time in the city center of Linz with over 40 participating businesses in cooperation with the OÖNachrichten and the Casino Linz.

At this point, the productive cooperation with **embassies and cultural institutes** as well as "film promotion offices" must not go unmentioned. Every year they contribute not only financial support but also ideas for the festival – representative for numerous partnerships, our special thanks this year go to the RKI – Romanian Cultural Institute in Vienna, the Istituto Italiano di Cultura Vienna, the Slovenian Cultural Information Center Skica, the Embassy of the Kingdom of Denmark and the Swedish Embassy in Vienna, also to German Films and the Eye Film Institute Netherlands. At the European level we thank our festival partners from the network "Moving Images – Open Borders". (see p. 28).

A further pillar of the success of past years is the fortunate and long-term networking with numerous local, national and international cultural and film institutions. From the beginning, it has been important to CROSSING EUROPE to enter into **partnerships with points of connection in content**. Numerous cooperations are to be named in this context, which are continued in 2018, as well as new collaborations. Cooperation is continued with CREATIVE REGION Linz & Upper Austria, which is again responsible for the CREATIVE REGION MUSIC VIDEO Audience Award. Another continuation is the cooperation with the CREATIVE EUROPE DESK AUSTRIA – CULTURE: this is already the fifth year that film works are presented under the label "Crossing X Danube" from countries of the Danube region all the way to the region of the Black Sea (see p. 27).

The **program focal point** *Cinema Next Europe*, the section established in 2015 for European young film talents, is also part of the program ensemble in 2018, again in cooperation with the young talents initiative "CINEMA NEXT – Young Cinema From Austria" and is intended to be a platform for exchange and networking. In addition, **cooperations** with the Chamber of Labor Upper Austria/Culture (Special *Working Worlds*), with the afo Architecture Forum Upper Austria (Special *Architecture and Society*), the Diagonale–Festival of Austrian Film (Austrian Screenings) and the Kepler Salon are also continued this year, as well as with the OÖKB-Upper Austrian Composers Association, the ÖKB-Austrian Composers Association, and the Federal Province of Upper Austria/Department of Culture in conjunction with the PICTURE your SOUND your PICTURE Atelier Award. In addition, the Art University Linz/Time-based and Interactive Media supports the **CROSSING EUROPE Talk & Discussion Events**. Along with the Art University Linz, further **university partners** are also the Bauhaus University Weimar, the Institute for Theater, Film and Media Studies of the University of Vienna, the University of Applied Sciences Kufstein, and the Academy of Fine Arts; around 130 students will attend the festival. With the discussion format "*kontroversiell!"* from dok.at we are happy to welcome a new partner for the discourse section at CROSSING EUROPE.

This year the following project cooperations go into the **second round**: the *CROSSING EUROPE Film Collection* on the Austrian VoD platform flimmit.com (p. 28), the film discourse program *Trouble Features* (in cooperation with diskolletiv), the networking meeting *Hotspot Film* for asylum-seekers and businesses from the field of film/media (p. 29), and the film education program *SCHOOL* @ *CROSSING EUROPE* (in cooperation with Kulturkontakt Austria), which is expanded with an additional morning this year with the short film program SMART UP YOUR LIFE. In addition, CROSSING EUROPE also welcomes for the first time a five-member *Youth Jury* to the festival, who will be awarding the CROSSING EUROPE Award – Youth Jury in 2018 (in cooperation with the secondary school HBLA für künstlerische Gestaltung Linz).

CROSSING EUROPE aims not only to present a young generation of directors from Europe to a broader audience, but also to honor their works with **money & material prizes**. In addition to the major funders City of Linz and Province of Upper Austria for the feature film competition, the endowment of the Social Media Awareness Award in the section *European Documentary* is provided by the gfk-Gesellschaft für Kulturpolitik OÖ, and for the Innovative Award in section *Local Artists*, by the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter. The material prize in the section Local Artists is provided since 2016 by THE GRAND POST—Audio Post Production for Film & TV. At this point, many, many thanks for the years of supporting our goals! (see p. 30)

In the days and weeks following CROSSING EUROPE there will be an opportunity to see **selected films from the festival program on the screen again**: already on 1 May in the cinema City-Kino highlights and prizewinning films, in Vienna at /slash einhalb in Filmcasino and the *Tribute films* by Edoardo Winspeare in Stadtkino, in Wels in the *Programmkino* in the MedienKulturHaus. Selected CROSSING EUROPE will also be shown at *Spielboden Dornbirn*, and a film from the series Working Worlds will be nominated as *AK Film of the Month* in Linz for May.

On the occasion of the 15th edition of the festival, in conclusion our very special thanks go to to the roughly 2,200 filmmakers, who have given us their trust since 2004 and who form the DNA of CROSSING EUROPE with their films.

Festival Opening

The festival already starts this year in the morning of the opening day (25 April) with the **start of films from all program sections**. The opening of CROSSING EUROPE is then celebrated in the evening with **six selected film premieres**, presenting a representative cross section of this year's festival program and the program sections – with numerous film guests present.

In the OK Offenes Kulturhaus the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter presents the installation THE LEOPARD (WESTERN UNION: SMALL BOATS), 2007 by the renowned British artist Isaac Julien, and the kulturtankstelle is represented with the projects ORAL HISTORIES: Alenka Maly and VERORTUNGEN: Fiona Ruckschcio. Starting at 10 pm, the Nightline in the OK Deck features the protagonist of one of the opening films, the Swedish rapper Silvana Imam, who is supported by the Austrian acts Selbstlaut and Kapazunda.

SOLDAȚII. POVESTE DIN FERENTARI / SOLDIERS. A STORY FROM FERENTARI (RO 2017) Austrian Premiere

For SOLDATII. POVESTE DIN FERENTARI Ada Solomon (Spotlight Guest 2018, details on p. 19) has again successfully collaborated with a "director discovery": with her **semi-documentary feature film debut** Ivana Mladenović has been invited to the renowned festivals in San Sebastián and Toronto. She tells a modern **gay Romeo-and-Juliet story** between an anthropologist and an ex-convict, set in the surroundings of the Roma community in the eponymous, notoriously desolate quarter of Bucharest.

JUPITER HOLDJA / JUPITER'S MOON (HU, DE 2017) - Austrian Premiere

Like numerous other directors in this year's program, the well-known Hungarian film and theater star **Kornél Mundruczó** has already been represented in **earlier years** with films at CROSSING EUROPE. This year he kicks off in Linz with a **competition entry from Cannes**.

JUPITER HOLDJA starts as a **thriller**, but in the course of the story set in **stunning imagery**, it also borrows from **fantastic film and science fiction**. A young Syrian refugee is on his way with his father from Serbia to Hungary, but at the border he is shot by a corrupt policeman. Instead of dying, though, or in a metaphorical sense capitulating before a cruel state power and cynical police power, the dead boy develops a super power, floating through the air like an angel, which brings unimagined consequences. JUPITER HOLDJA can thus be read as an **up-to-date response to Hungary's omnipresent isolationist policies** and refugee paranoia.

SILVANA (SE 2017) — Austrian Premiere

"Let's smash patriarchy!" shouts the **Swedish rapper Silvana Imam** to her audience. Her raps are raw and **autobiographically** influenced, often revolving around sexual identity. Having come to Sweden as a child – Syrian father, Lithuanian mother – she addresses her background as an immigrant as well as the **sociopolitical state of Sweden**. The documentary portrait begins in 2014, the year of her musical breakthrough, accompanies her rapid rise as a lesbian, feminist and anti-racist "punk rapper" with no inhibitions about speaking her mind, but also the course of her relationship with the Swedish pop artist Beatrice Eli. SILVANA is a **political music documentary** that appeals not only to dedicated fans. A strong film about a courageous protagonist, who fights for a better world with her powerful music.

PIZZICATA (IT, DE 1996)

<u>Director</u>: Edoardo Winspeare

This year's TRIBUTE section is devoted to the Italian director Edoardo Winspeare (*1965), an auteur filmmaker par excellence. Through decades of intense engagement with his home region and the social, political and economic changes and the cultural shifts in Apulia, he is considered an important representative of Italian "neo neo-realism". (Detailed information about the Tribute on p. 18). In 1988 Winspeare was accepted at the University of Film and Television in Munich, which also co-produced his feature film debut PIZZICATA. This debut film is a love story between an Italo-American pilot of the US Army, who crashes in Salento in 1943, and one of the three daughters of a farmer who gives him shelter. PIZZICATA won numerous awards and was shown internationally in cinemas.

Alenka Maly, film director and actress from Linz, took her own intensive "conversation relationship" with her grandmother as the starting point for the realization of the European **Oral History film project** THE EUROPEAN GRANDMA PROJECT. With the motto "Grandmothers telling their versions of European history", in 2015 she launched a European-wide call and found **eight like-minded filmmakers**, who created **portraits of their grandmothers** in parallel to one another in Israel, Greece, Italy, Iceland, Bulgaria, Russia, England, Turkey and Austria. These women, born in the 20s and early 30s of the last century, tell their filmmaking granddaughters about war, political upheavals, love, and everyday life in their time in Europe. Alenka Maly and her colleagues have succeeded in capturing an **authentic panorama of European history** on film and creating a small cinematic memorial for a group of strong women, which offers an insight into the dark chapters of European history of the 20th century for the generations born later.

THE CURED (IE 2017) - Austrian Premiere

After a virus has turned those infected with it into **blood-thirsty zombies** for years, the world finds new hope with the discovery of a cure. But **rebuilding society** turns out to be difficult, as reintegrating those formerly infected becomes a special challenge. It is one of these, specifically her brother-in-law, that a young widow (embodied by the indie icon Ellen Page) takes into her home, which does not remain without dramatic consequences.

Everything revolves around the question of how a society should deal with taking those presumably responsible – now made "innocuous" – back into their midst. With his **splatter-horror debut**, director David Freyne succeeds in creating an exciting combination of zombie horror and social drama, creating a space for **current social-critical commentaries** – 28 DAYS LATER and CHILDREN OF MEN send their regards.

Closing Film 2018

Between the multifaceted opening day and this year's closing event on 30 April, there are **182 films** from more than **40 countries**, film discussions with **140** film guests, talks, masterclasses, installation projects, and six Nightline nights. The **15th** edition of the festival concludes with a **final highlight**: the festival audience can look forward to a most current **Berlinale title** – TRANSIT, the new work by the "doyen" of the Berlin School, Christian Petzold.

TRANSIT (DE, FR 2018) - Austrian Premiere

Director: Christian Petzold

<u>Press Screening</u>: 19 April, 10:00 am (Moviemento Linz), 25 April, 12:00 pm (Stadtkino Vienna) Dem The screening of the film will be preceded by a prologue by the actress and theater director Verena Koch. Christian Petzold, a representative of the first generation of the Berlin School, focuses in his latest work on what is currently Europe's most acute question: displacement, flight and migration. The film is based on the novel by Anna Seghers of the same name, which was written between 1941 and 1942 in Marseilles. In the 1970s and 1980s TRANSIT was received particularly as a masterpiece of German exile literature.

A young man manages to flee to Marseilles just before the German troops invade Paris. There he assumes a false identity to obtain the life-saving documents that will allow him to emigrate from Europe. Petzold sets the timeless story in Marseilles of today. The figures from the past move there and meet the refugees of the present. History thus merges with the present and "all stories conjoin into an eternal transit space." (Berlinale

A main role is brilliantly performed by **Franz Rogowski**, who is well remembered by the CROSSING EUROPE audience as the shy masseur in Jakob Lass's love story LOVE STEAKS (CE 2014) as well as the feature film UNS GEHT ES GUT (CE 2015) and has now been nominated for the *Berlinale Shooting Stars 2018*.

Eleven Austrian premieres are found this year in this section, which covers a broad spectrum of themes and forms. In the selected feature films we see young people at the crossroads (KÖRFEZ), ready to take the leap into "real" adult life (ANTÓNIO UM DOIS TRÊS) or trapped between two cultures (CHARMØREN, HVA VIL FOLK SI), dysfunctional family and sibling relationships (IL CRATERE, VINTERBRØDRE), female self-empowerment (SASHISHI DEDA), and relationships in an emotional state of emergency (HJÄRTAT, MARTESA, MORIR, SOLDAŢII. POVESTE DIN FERENTARI).

ARCHITECTURE AND SOCIETY - SPACE, POWER, CONTROL

(in cooperation with afo Architecture Forum Upper Austria)

CROSSING EUROPE presents the section **Architecture and Society**, curated by Lotte Schreiber, now already for the nineth time. Under the title **SPACE**, **POWER**, **CONTROL**, this section examines the various interplays between space and power, or more precisely architectural spaces and delimited territories that demonstrate various various political, social, and economic power relations.

The architectural self-presentation of totalitarian regimes is present in Europe up to today. Benito Mussolini's power obsession, for instance, is reflected in the "Corte d'Assise", the Court of Justice in Milan, setting of the award-winning documentary LA CONVOCAZIONE. The short film DUE focuses on the district of "Milano Due", built in the 1970s, which was Berlusconi's first major investment project. The crime scene of the concentration camp Buchenwald, now a memorial site, is sensitively approached in DER MENSCH IST EIN SCHÖNER GEDANKE. VOLKHARD KNIGGE UND BUCHENWALD. The power of media is the theme taken up by LETZTES JAHR IN UTOPIA, a reconstruction of a media-staged group experiment. The village of BRAGUINO is located in Siberia, setting of a feud between two family clans. Power structures manifested through the control of space in the eponymous district of Brussels is the theme of the trenchant short film NETTOYER SCHAERBEEK.

Tribute 2018: Edoardo Winspeare (IT)

The decade at the beginning of the 1980s must be regarded as a significant break in Italian film. Dubbing trimmed to standard language increasingly gave way to direct sound. Viewers were suddenly confronted with a multitude of language variations, and marginalized regions became interesting for the screen. Sicily and Naples started the trend, Apulia followed in the 90s. While Sergio Rubini immortalized the region around Bari in film, Edoardo Winspeare shot his first feature film in 1996 in the micro-region of Alento in the extreme south-east. Since then he has located almost all his films in the vicinity of Lecce. (Markus Vorauer, film scholar)

CROSSING EUROPE devotes this year's **TRIBUTE** to the Italian director **Edoardo Winspeare**, an **auteur filmmaker** par excellence. Through decades of intense engagement with his home region, the social, political and economic changes and the cultural shifts in Apulia, he is an important representative of socalled **"regional" cinema**. Edoardo Winspeare was born in **1965** in Klagenfurt, Austria, but since his earliest childhood he has lived in Salento in the south of Italy. He began his career in film as an assistant editor in New York; in 1988 he was accepted at the University of Film and Television in Munich, which also coproduced his feature film debut **PIZZICATA**. In the course of his nearly 30-year career, Winspeare has created **about 40 works**. In addition to the six feature films, these also include documentaries, short films and advertising films. In 1992 he co-founded the the band **Officina Zoé**, which has been influential in reanimating the traditional rhythms and dances (like Pizzica and Tarantella) of Salento and has also provided music for Winspeare's films. He also organizes cultural festivals in his home region and is actively involved in the protection of the regional landscape.

For the coming festival edition, a presentation of his six feature films is planned in conjunction with the TRIBUTE section, including his current film LA VITA IN COMUNE, which celebrated its world premiere at the Venice International Film Festival in 2017.

PIZZICATA (IT, DE 1996), 91 min.

Edoardo Winspeare's debut film **PIZZICATA** is a love story between an Italo-American pilot from the US army, who crashes in Salento in 1943, and one of the three daughters of a farmer who gives him shelter. It received numerous awards and was shown in cinemas internationally.

SANGUE VIVO / LIVE BLOOD (IT 2000), 95 min.

His second feature film, **SANGUE VIVO**, also garnered numerous awards at international festivals and tells of the love-hate relationship between two brothers with a fatal end. Here again, the director locates the plot in the region around Lecce. His individual artistic signature (such as the real setting and the use of amateur actors speaking the local dialect) is also clearly evident here.

IL MIRACOLO / THE MIRACLE (IT 2003), 93 min.

IL MIRACOLO celebrated its world premiere at the Venic International Film Festival and was distinguished with two awards. The film centers around a 12-year-old boy, whose alleged abilities as miraculous healer are commercially exploited by his own parents.

GALANTUOMINI / BRAVE MEN (IT 2008), 100 min.

In **GALANTUOMINI**, which premiered at the Rome Film Festival, Winspeare takes up the theme of the rise of the mafia – Sacra Corona Unitá – in Apulia in the 1980s, creating a melodrama against the background of organized crime and corruption.

IN GRAZIA DI DIO / QUIET BLISS (IT 2014), 127 min. - Österreichpremiere CE 2015

IN GRAZIA DI DIO (World Premiere: Berlinale Panorama) deals with four women who are not willing to submit to the dominant power of the global economy. Self-empowered by tolerance, solidarity, and self-reliance, they build a new existence together.

LA VITA IN COMUNE / THE ARK OF DISPERATA (IT 2017), 110 min. — Austrian Premiere

With **LA VITA IN COMUNE** Winspeare was invited again to the Venice International Film Festival. This time he chooses the genre of comedy to pose the feeling of life in Southern Italy as a counter-strategy to turbo-capitalism.

SPOTLIGHT: Ada Solomon (RO)

"Ada Solomon is currently one of the most important film producers in Romania, if not THE most important. She has succeeded with the feat of bringing numerous directors into the spotlight of A-festivals, while developing a unique artistic signature with them at the same time. She is also known for her extremely professional way of working and is not afraid to take on 'difficult' material that catalyzes careers, sweeps up festival awards, and contributes substantially to the standing of the 'New Romanian Cinema'." (Andrei Tănăsescu, Programmer Toronto Int. FF)

Ada Solomon (*1968) from Romania has been working as a producer for **over 20 years extremely successfully**, and that all over Europe. Her apparently **infallible sense of talent** has already catalyzed a number of careers. For instance, she set the tracks for the feature film debuts by Radu Jude (CEA MAI FERICITA FATA DIN LUME), Melissa de Raaf and Razvan Radulescu (FELICIA INAINTE DE TOATE), and Paul Negoescu (O LUNA IN THAILANDIA). In addition, she is also known for her versatility, so that short films, feature films AND documentaries are listed in her filmography. Ada Solomon also co-founded the NexT Int. Film Festival Bucharest.

Productions from her companies <u>HiFilm Productions</u> (founded 2004) or <u>Parada Film</u> are invited to the **most prestigious festivals** in the world, whether it is Berlin, Cannes, Locarno or Venice, and are also **distinguished with awards**: e.g. DIN DRAGOSTE CU CELE MAI BUNE INTENTII (RO, HU, FR 2011; D: Adrian Sitaru) in Locarno, POZITIA COPILULUI (RO 2012; D: Călin Peter Netzer) with the Golden Bear at the Berlinale, and AFERIM! (RO, GB, CZ 2015; D: Radu Jude) with the Silver Bear at the Berlinale.

At the European Film Awards in 2013, Ada Solomon was awarded the **PRIX EURIMAGES – European Co-Production Prize** for her "decisive role in the field of European co-productions". It is therefore hardly

surprising that she was also involved as executive producer in one of the prime examples of European coproductions in recent years: TONI ERDMANN (DE, AT, CH, RO 2016; D: Maren Ade). Further ties to Austria in her work are found with Katharina Copony's documentary film OCEANUL MARE (AT, DE, RO 2009) and the new documentary film by Johannes Holzhausen, THE ROYAL TRAIN (AT, RO 2018).

Films produced by Ada Solomon have already been shown at past editions of CROSSING EUROPE, such as in 2011 the two feature films PRINCIPII DE VIATA / PRINCIPLES OF LIFE (RO 2010; D: Constantin Popescu) and CEA MAI FERICITA FATA DIN LUME (RO, NL 2009; D: Radu Jude). In the SPOTLIGHT section of the coming festival, a presentation of seven feature-length films and a short film program is planned, including two current works (a feature film and a documentary in the competition sections).

NIGHT SIGHT

For the eleventh time, the film journalist and festival producer Markus Keuschnigg has again curated the NIGHT SIGHT at CROSSING EUROPE. Five films will be presented again this year – all of them to be categorized as "fantastic film". This year the curator places the section under the motto: "The Stranglehold of Good Taste. This year's Night Sight is accordingly proud of allowing the (in the best sense) deviant and the painful to win out and to whisk the audience away into five more or less dangerous worlds of imagination."

The Night Sight opener **THE CURED** unfolds a contemporary political allegory, in which "cured" ex-zombies struggle for social re-integration (see p. 10). The (presumed) hunters become the hunted, both in **REVENGE** by Coralie Fargeat and in Benjamin Barfoot's **DOUBLE DATE**, as strong women ultimately set the tone. In Bertrand Mandico's **LES GARÇONS SAUVAGES** the wild boys from the title are loaded onto a galley for the purpose of domestication and brought to a mysterious island with luxurious (and supernatural) vegetation. A "parallel world" also unfolds in **HOUSEWIFE**, as an old acquaintance (presumed to have disappeared) entices a well-to-do woman into a sect, where a guru seeks to tear down all boundaries between dream and reality.

CINEMA NEXT EUROPE: Sense and Sensibility

In 2015 CROSSING EUROPE first set a **focus** on the "next generation" of European filmmakers in cooperation with the young talents initiative Cinema Next Europe. This section, which is intended to be a platform for pan-European exchange and networking, thus goes into the fourth round this year, curated by Wiktoria Pelzer and Dominik Tschütscher. The emphasis is again on **discovering fresh voices** and **promoting young European cinema**. Strong positions of young European film are presented in six hand-picked film programs under the title **Sense and Sensibility**: young filmmakers who present a strong calling card with their current works.

Whether it is the esprit de corps of a *Burschenschaft* in Munich (**GERMANIA**), concentrated girl-power (**TEAM HURRICANE**) or an assessment of the state of "homo ludens" (**PLAYING MEN**), both topicality and timelessness can be attributed to all these works. The section also comprises three short film programs, which deal with everyday life within relationship constellations among families and friends, streams of movement within Europe, and with individuality vs. loneliness and the challenges of living together.

With Cinema Next Europa a **European platform for young talents in film** is to be created within the festival. This section is addressed, on the one hand, to all those filmmakers who want to go a step further in the direction of a professional "film career" and on the other to an audience interested in the filmmaking work of the "next generation".

LOCAL ARTISTS

A total of 150 works were entered for this program section. For this year's festival edition, 58 productions were selected, which are presented in 18 program positions – including 16 world premieres, 8 Austrian premieres and one international premiere. Once again, the very popular LOCAL ARTISTS section offers an attractive overview of current Upper Austrian filmmaking, ranging from experimental film to socio-political documentary. This year there are also discoveries to be made among the mid-length films and in the music video field; 15 music videos are competing for the CREATIVE REGION MUSIC VIDEO Audience Award (€ 1.500,-). Further awards that will also be presented to films/videos from this section are the CROSSING EUROPE Award – Local Artist with a value of € 7.000,- (€ 5.000,- Province of Upper Austria/Culture & € 2.000,- The Grand Post-Audio & Picture Post Production) and the CROSSING EUROPE Innovative Award – Local Artist (€ 3.500,-), which is covered by the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter and goes to a work with an innovative artistic approach. (More on awards and juries, see p. 30).

Two world premieres lead the field of this year's LOCAL ARTISTS selection. One is the documentary film project THE EUROPEAN GRANDMA PROJECT (AT, IL, GB, IS, IT, TR, BG, GR, RU 2018) by the Linz filmmaker and actress Alenka Maly and eight further directors (Hadas Neuman, Fleur Nieddu, Anna Ólafsdóttir, Giorgia Polizzi, Berke Soyuer, Desislava Tsoneva, Maria Tzika, Ekaterina Volkova) – a harmonious panorama of European contemporary history, which is also part of the festival opening on 25 April. The other is Fiona Ruckschcio's second part of her documentary treatment of the theme of everyday sexism, < COMMON.PLACES 2 >, which focuses on persons and their personal stories of harassment, mobbing and racism.

Two **feature-length documentary** films in this section are thematically strongly "rooted" in Upper Austria and deal with two prototypes in terms of **founding identity**: Local Artists award-winner 2014, Jakob Kubizek, traces his own socialization as a music-loving adolescent and brings the development history of the alternative cultural association *Röda* in Steyr to the screen (JEDEM DORF SEIN UNDERGROUND). Dominik Thaller, on the other hand, devotes his feature-length debut to the richly historical and much-beloved Linz football club *Blau Weiß Linz* (IMMER WIEDER GEHT DIE SONNE AUF).

Flight and integration are the themes of the two documentary films **SARGIS - DAS LEBEN IST SO EINE SACHE** and **THE FIRST GENERATION - ZWISCHEN ÖSTERREICH UND KAMBODSCHA**. In his sensitive portrait of an athlete, Stefan Langthaler documents Sargis Martiroysan's years of "fighting" to finally be able to officially compete for Austria in weight-lifting. The documentary work by the brothers Abraham and Kemara Pol centers around five members of the Cambodian community and their fates in Austria.

With "Introducing Sarkaut Mostefa" CROSSING EUROPE presents a work by a young Kurdish Iraqi, who has now found a home in Austria. The filmmaker Sarkaut Mostefa already made short films before he fled. Thanks to the MORE program at the Art University Linz, he can now work as an artist in Austria. Three of his works are part of the festival program (REMOTE CONTROL, DU RU and XIRIS).

Represented again at CROSSING EUROPE is also the director Bernhard Sallmann, originally from Upper Austria, now based in Berlin. Last year he presented the first part of his Fontane tetalogy with **ODERLAND.FONTANE** and was distinguished for it with the LOCAL ARTIST Award. Now he returns with the **international premiere** of the second part, **RHINLAND. FONTANE**, of his experimental documentary film project. Here again he has created a montage of literary quotations with authentic, static location and landscape shots. In her first feature-length documentary film KEIN **HALBES LEBEN** Sybille Bauer focuses intently on the relationship between humans and animals, or more precisely between human and dog, and the potential in this for consolation in the face of loss. // KEIN HALBES LEBEN will be shown again in conjunction with the cooperation with the Programmkino Wels on 30 April at 8:15 pm and on 2 May at 6:15 pm. //

With the **short and mid-length works**, the audience can expect a multifaceted survey with <u>two "mixed" short film programs</u>, which are distinguished by a diversity of genres, themes and styles – the filmmakers include past award-winners such as Remo Rauscher, Leni Gruber and Maria Czernohorszky. The program LOCAL ARTISTS – DOCUMENTARY comprises new works, among others by Violette Wakolbinger and Herwig Kerschner, Thomas Draschan, Reinhold Bidner and the award-winners Gerhard Treml and Leo Calice.

In the **experimental field** the audience can look forward to <u>high-quality experimental filmmaking</u>: filmmakers include the master Dietmar Brehm (29 PUNKTE PROGRAMM), Karin FissIthaler (ALICE REMIXED), Siegfried A. Fruhauf with PHANTOM RIDE PHANTOM as well as Conny Zenk and Tanja Brüggemann (REGLOS). A special highlight in this context will certainly be the screening of selected LOCAL ARTISTS experimental films in <u>DEEP SPACE 8K</u> in the Ars Electronica Center (29 April, 3:00 pm) with wall and floor projections – physical cinema in the truest sense.

For music-lovers, the music video competition again offers an exquisite selection of altogether 15 local works. With a broad range of music genres – including ASH MY LOVE, TEXTA, PAROV STELAR FT. MUDDY WATERS or WOODPIGEON – local filmmakers such as Felix Huber and Manuel Knoflach, Gloria Gammer, Lorenz Tröbinger, Marie Luise Lehner and Jola Wieczorek present their most recent works.

Festivaltrailer: INSIDE 521 (AT 2018, 1 min)

CROSSING EUROPE is delighted to announce that the **new festival trailer** this year is by the Linz-based **artist Michael Wirthig**, who has already presented numerous films over the years at CROSSING EUROPE (including Headcrash / CE 2017, Inside R-3 / CE 2012, Sunrich Orange / CE 2012 or Inside The Bag / CE 2013, Inside The Head / CE2016). Michael Wirthig (*1978) studied **media design** at the Art University Linz and has dealt intensively since 2000 with artistic **photography and experimental film**. In this context he is especially interested in **deconstructing** objects, devices and plant structures and also in the **relationships between the inside and the outside world**, which is particularly evident in his current work INSIDE 521. INSIDE 521 is a **study on the inside and the outside of an analog 16mm projector**. The external form of a Bolex 521 projector was dissolved to reveal its inner life. The content thus gains a new space and individual components are made visible. Photographing these details as single frames turns them into new cinematic moving images. At the sound level the focus is also on the relationship between inside and outside. For this, Mathias Burghofer composed an **experimental sound collage** on the strings of an open grand piano. The former analog film projector is thus shifted into focus and so becomes a digital cinema copy itself, in keeping with the 15th anniversary of CROSSING EUROPE.

CROSSOVER

IN THE UPPER AUSTRIAN CULTURE QUARTER

Again in 2018 the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter is the established festival location and vibrant festival center, bringing in two new venues this year: projects especially developed for these locations will be shown, which go beyond the conventional crossover between film and visual art into the public space of a former filling station and which also reach a different audience in Unten. At the intersection between art institution and Moviemento, Meyer-SchinkSeyerl integrate entertainment elements from public space, including an advertising space for film posters in the "Market Place" of the OK. In the square OK Platz, graffiti by Fresh Max marks the entrance to the festival center.

OK | ISAAC JULIEN

The Leopard (Western Union: Small Boats), 2007

Individual paths, passages and journeys are explored locally on multiple monitors to refer to the global scenario. The work was produced at a time when immigration policies and the relationships between the individual and the geopolitical were being vehemently discussed. The award-winning artist and filmmaker Isaac Julien traces the effects of traumas, not only on people but also on buildings, monuments, architecture and life by poetically shifting these themes. The internationally acclaimed choreographer Russell Maliphant choreographed a series of vignettes (small dance pieces) in different locations, where dance and body

movements are used to repeat these journeys, but also to newly articulate them. *The Leopard*, (2007) uses the language of experimental film to convey what is abstract and suggestive, rather than relying on strict narration. A captivating work as a response to the banal debates about migration in Europe in the age of globalization.

THE Coop-Lab of the Upper Austrian Culture Quarter and the Art University Linz

The kulturtankstelle presents itself as an archive for women's stories.

<u>Verortungen – Fiona Rukschcio</u>: Fiona Rukschcio's video < <u>common.places 1 ></u>, which is shown in the former tire-changing box, is a kind of "oral history of sexual assault". 27 women tell of harassment situation, but also of individual self-defense tactics – "resistance" is thematized in the form of film stills in the car wash. <u>Oral Histories – Alenka Maly</u>: The portraits from the festival entry THE EUROPEAN GRANDMA PROJECT by Alenka Maly are shown in the former shop in their full length. The project sketches out a very personal European contemporary history, told by nine grandmothers in conversation with their filmmaking granddaughters. (Film description p. 10)

CROSSING EUROPE @ AEC

Following 2017, CROSSING EUROPE is again welcomed with two screenings as a guest in the renowned AEC Ars Electronica Center that is, just like CROSSING EUROPE, an important ambassador for Linz as UNESCO City of Media Arts.

The World Wide Web has meanwhile lost its aura of being a catalyst for a radical renewal of our democracy. Instead, we find ourselves confronted with a development in the direction of a surveillance tool antithetical to democracy. The German director Sandra Trostel starts at exactly this point and places Europe's largest hacker association, the Chaos Computer Club (CCC) – winner of the Golden Nica of the Prix Ars Electronica in 2010 – at the center of her documentary film <u>ALL CREATURES WELCOME</u> (DE 2018), which celebrates its world premiere during CROSSING EUROPE. In this film designed as an "adventure game" Trostel succeeds in getting rid of conventional hacker clichés and exploring "Planet Nerd". At the same time, it becomes clear how hacker culture faces the challenges of our times and can be an inspiration for possible social upheavals.

FILM EDUCATION at CROSSING EUROPE

SCHOOL @ CROSSING EUROPE (in cooperation with KulturKontakt Austria)

The "school of viewing" does not begin with entering into adult life, but much earlier, as we are already confronted, even flooded with moving images in childhood and adolescence. Started as a pilot project in 2017 – entitled SCHOOL @ CROSSING EUROPE – in 2018 CROSSING EUROPE has expanded activities in the field of film education and the acquisition of media literacy for school pupils and apprentices. With specially composed film screenings of current European cinema films, the festival seeks to enable a differentiated engagement with the medium of film, its aesthetics, and its different formations for young people. The programme is addressed to school pupils and apprentices from 14 to 18 and their teachers, but especially to all who want to deal more intensively with the medium of film in class.

In 2018 the offer of screenings was expanded to **three mornings**. The focus here is on direct communication with the filmmakers and an engagement with the medium of film. Especially prepared **school materials** support teachers in preparing for viewing the films and discussing them afterwards. All films are shown in German and/or with German subtitles, each with an introduction and followed by a film discussion. The following films are included in the program: DRÖM VIDARE (SE 2017), BLIND & HÄSSLICH (DE 2017) and the short film program SMART UP YOUR LIFE (AT 2017/18).

The so-called "Social Climate Day" takes place now for the fifth time on 27 April 2018. Numerous associations and institutions dedicate this day to the improvement of the social climate in Austria. In keeping with this, the **short film program "Smart Up Your Life"** presents video works created during video workshops and school projects since fall/winter 2017/18. Starting from the paperback book "I'm not going along with that ... Arguments for Living Together Well", young people used their smartphones to shoot short films on the theme "Approaching One Another: Fleeing – Interculture – Living Together". They were then invited to enter these for the "Smart Up Your Life" short film competition (until 16 February 2018) – as an offer for young people to become artistically active in the fields of storytelling, new media and global learning, because media skills today also increasingly mean political skills.

Selected contributions from this competition will be shown during CROSSING EUROPE in conjunction with "School @ Crossing Europe". – "Smart Up Your Life" is a cooperation project of Welthaus Linz, the department of development policies of the Diocese of Linz, "Land der Menschen – Aufeinander zugehen OÖ" and the Federal Province of Upper Austria.

FILM APPRENTICES @ CROSSING EUROPE (with support from the Linz AG)

Around **50 apprentices** from the Linz AG are thus offered an opportunity to attend events on the theme of film and media skills during the festival.

The project is arranged in three phases – "SEEING Film", "EXPERIENCING Film", "MAKING Film" – and is intended to enable the reception of and engagement with filmic content and to convey the experience "film festival" and basic knowledge of filmmaking.


